For a really interesting day out over the Christmas holidays why not visit the Manchester Museum of Science and Industry (MOSI) and meet the Baby?

The Baby, or the Manchester Small-Scale Experimental Machine, was the world's first Stored-Program Computer that operated successfully for the first time on 21 June 1948 at the University of Manchester.

Amazingly it was built using technology developed during World War II for radar and communications equipment!

It has less computing power than a modern day calculator and yet it's 5.2 metres long, 2.2 metres high and weighs one tonne!

Good news to end the year on: manufacturing growth strongest since 1995 says CBI

Growth in the UK's manufacturing sector was the strongest for 18 years according to the latest CBI Industrial Trends Survey.

Both the size of total order books and the pace of output growth over the past three months were the highest recorded since 1995, showing the recovery in UK manufacturing is accelerating.

The survey of nearly 350 manufacturers found that total order books relative to normal levels were their strongest since March 1995. Export order books were also very firmly above average.
